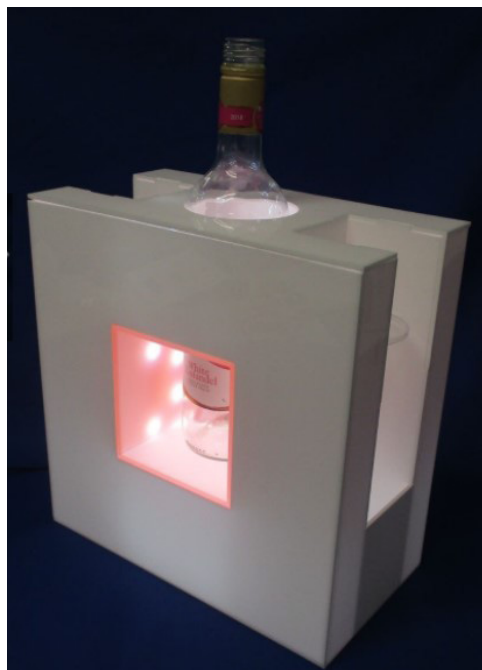
Design Technology

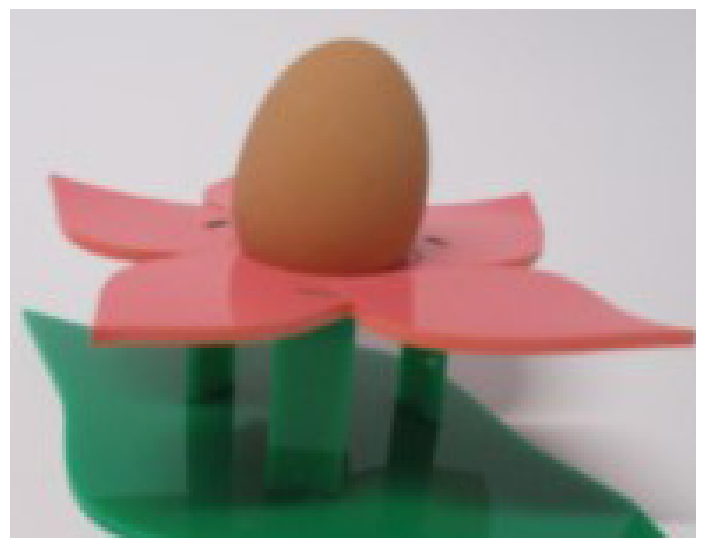
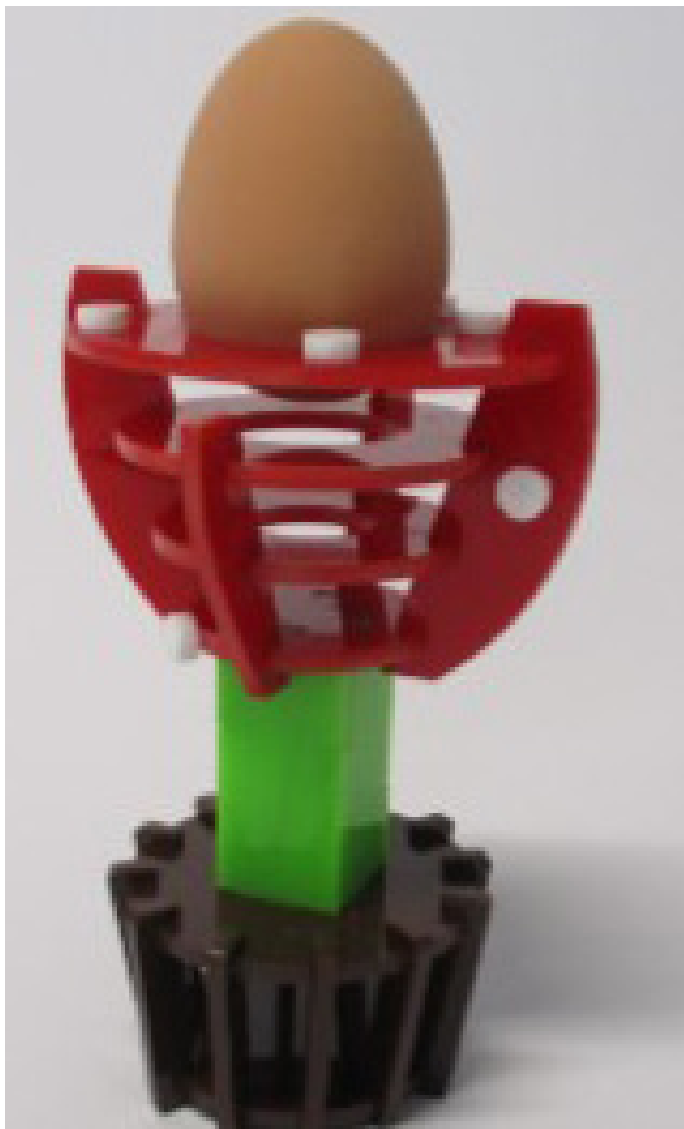


Year 9 Design Technology students with fans that they have designed and made. Students had to develop their CAD 2D Design skills and soldering skills to create their completed working fan.
