### Bourne's Donations to Ukraine

I am struggling with finding the right words to convey the sheer generosity of staff and students at Bourne Community College. With just two days' notice, on Thursday 3rd March I was able to take an entire van load of donations to Compton Tea Rooms collection point where 30+ volunteers were ready to sort through and box up all of the items ready for transportation to the Poland/ Ukraine border on Friday 4th March (With Luke pictured).

The generosity of our students and staff was quite amazing, we had boxes and boxes of new toiletries, warm hats and gloves and scarves, socks and shoes, games, nappies, baby food, toys, sweets, food, coats and clothes. It was quite unbelievable how much was gathered in such a short time.

When I arrived with everything, I was told that unfortunately they didn't have room for all of the clothes as they were prioritising everything else, so instead they were taken to the British Red Cross where they could be sold and funds raised for their work in Ukraine supporting victims of the war. One very special item had to be the package of letters from students. Our students have huge hearts and have responded amazingly to this developing situation with maturity and kindness. Thanks must also go to my husband for the loan of his van and all the students who helped me carry everything to it!

If there are any further collections in the future we'll put out a parent mail with as much notice as possible.

In the meantime if your child would like to do anything else to help raise funds for Ukraine they can carry out sponsored activities as part of their RE Independent study projects or speak to their tutor about opportunities to get involved in support efforts.

Many thanks again for everyone who helped make this happen, what a wonderful school community effort.






