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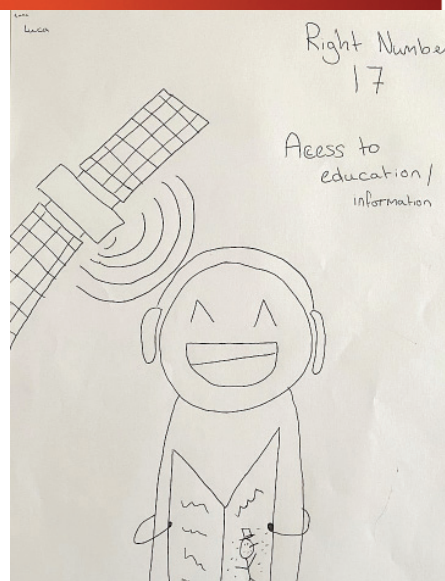

Although Henry has no formal qualifications, his exemplary behaviour and super manners,

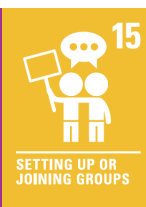


have proved him worthy of becoming our working Therapy dog and he comes with glowing references from his owner, Mrs. Stapleton, Personal Learning Manager of The Place.

Research has shown that the presence of a dog in the classroom can have a beneficial effect on students including: improved academic achievement; increased literacy skills; calming behaviours; teaching responsibility and respect to all life; increased confidence and improved motivation. Part of Henry's new role will be to work closely on a one-

to-one basis to encourage struggling readers to practice reading aloud, helping them to increase their reading levels and social development. He will offer re-assurance to those students who may have gone through upsetting or difficult times, or who struggle with social interaction.

- when you are travelling by public or dedicated school transport, don't forget to: wear a face covering (unless you are exempt)

- social distance where possible
- do not congregate in large groups anywhere on stations/ bus stops or in parks
- wash or sanitise your hands regularly
- be considerate to fellow passengers and staff.
